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


Our Research Numbers

Target market: 134,600 registered vehicles need to be shifted away from fossil fuels in 8.5 years – 80% of these: biofuels

From our experimental results, we calculate and project that one year of transportation in Barbados requires:

- 685,304,000 litres of high COD rum distillery waste
- 105,759 tons of fresh sargassum in a year.

In 2017, 20, 000, 000 tons of Sargassum seaweed were estimated to inundate the Caribbean Sea and the central Atlantic Ocean presenting evidence that more than sufficient volumes of fresh sargassum are available in Barbados' EEZ
